



Alternatively, you can arrive the previous day for more comfort as well!



Upon your arrival, you will be transferred to your hotel, The Ranee. This exclusive 24-room boutique hotel is strategically situated in the heart of Kuching's charming Old Town. The Ranee is a stylish reconstruction of two traditional 19th-century shophouses, ingeniously adapted to modern standards of comfort and luxury. What sets it apart is the individuality, charm, and character of each spacious room and suite. During your stay, you'll be accommodated in one of their signature suites, offering a lavish experience in the Loft. These suites are inspired by and named after prominent women in Sarawak's history, including Margaret de Windt, Sarawak's first Ranee, and her descendants.

Your private Borneo tour starts with the exploration of Kuching. Embark on a 3-hour sightseeing tour with a local tour guide through the heart of the Old Town. Begin at the Main Bazaar, a lively thoroughfare lined with charming shophouses and colonial-era buildings. Continue to Carpenter Street, where century-old shophouses whisper tales of the past. Marvel at the Old Courthouse, the Round Tower, the Pavilion Building, and the grand Central Post Office. Venture to the Sarawak Museum for profound insights into the region's history. Engage with locals to learn about the mystique of Sarawak gambir, known for its unique properties, and savor the renowned Sarawak pepper. Taste fresh, juicy local pineapples, bursting with tropical sweetness while stroll through Chinese shophouses with its stunning architectural influences, and follow a muraladorned lane to the vibrant India Street, where Indian businesses thrive.






Engage with shopkeepers, try traditional crafts, and immerse yourself in the exotic spices that fill the air. This journey through Kuching's past and present also unveils the intriguing history of the White Rajas and their influence on Sarawak, shedding light on the dynamics of colonial rule and its lasting impact.

Following your adventure, spend some free time along Kuching Waterfront, a distinctive landmark with its own historical significance. Once a row of "godowns" housing trade supplies, it now offers breathtaking views of old Kuching. It also serves as a hub for river taxis known as "sampans," which have been a popular means of river transportation for centuries, connecting both sides of the river.

To savor the majesty of a Borneo sunset and the enchanting ambiance of Kuching at night, embark on a sunset river cruise – an unforgettable way to experience this charming city. Along the way, you'll spot landmarks such as the Astana (the governor's residence) and the Dewan Undangan Negeri Sarawak (State Parliament), as well as stilt homes, houseboats, and the timeless river activities. After your 1.5-hour river cruise, we will take you to a local restaurant to savor some delicious regional specialties.

The Lepan Restaurant (or something similar) has a cozy atmosphere which is a replica of a traditional Kayan "kampung" farm-hut. You will get the chance to try their signature dishes, including manok pansoh (chicken cooked in bamboo, a Dayak Harvest Festival delicacy), terung asam soup (a popular chicken soup made with native wild eggplant), and Midin Kerabu (a Sarawak salad crafted from local fern), all served with Bario brown rice wrapped in isip leaf.



Explore Bako National Park, renowned as one of Asia's smallest yet most diverse national parks on a full-day tour from Kuching. With your experienced private nature guide, tailor treks to your specific interests, gain fascinating insights into Bako National Park's unique biodiversity, and spot Proboscis Monkeys, macaques, and flying lemurs! Afterward, return to Kuching and immerse yourself in the vibrant Siniawan Night Market for a taste of local delights.

A single day is all you need to uncover the beauty of Bako National Park, one of Southeast Asia's smallest national parks. Your today's adventure starts with an early 20 miles car ride from Kuching to Kampung Bako, followed by a brief 20-minute boat ride to reach the park.

Bako National Park is a treasure trove of Bornean flora, teeming with abundant wildlife, hidden beaches, hiking trails, jungle streams, and enchanting waterfalls. Keep an eye out for the park's charismatic star, the Proboscis Monkey, a comical rainforest inhabitant known for its big nose and pot-belly. This star performer shares the stage with long-tailed macaque monkeys, silvered leaf monkeys, monitor lizards, squirrels, and flying lemurs, all easily spotted within the park's lush backdrop, which houses an astonishing diversity of plant and animal life.



Your visit to Bako National Park will be made even more special with the guidance of an experienced nature guide. They will help you plan your treks based on your interests and preferences, offering suggestions, creating a tailored itinerary, and sharing insights into the park's ecological wonders and history. Don't forget to pack appropriate clothing and supplies for your treks. Spend the day inside the National Park with your local guide, explore the area and head on a trek to find the famous residents of the park!

Upon returning to Kuching in the late afternoon, you can spend your evening at your comfortable hotel. If your visit falls on a Friday, Saturday, or Sunday, consider exploring the vibrant Siniawan Night Market, located 21 kilometers from Kuching city. This picturesque town comes alive in the evening, offering a delightful experience of food and merriment. Siniawan's charming street is flanked by historic wooden townhouses illuminated by traditional Chinese lanterns. In recent years, Siniawan has invested in its weekend night markets, promoting local traditions and cultures while boosting the economy through tourism. Be sure to savor local delights such as pitcher plant rice, locally known as Lemang Periuk Kera, and a variety of traditional Chinese, Malay, and Dayak cuisines. Don't miss out on Lui Teh and Ngo Hiang; they come highly recommended. Later on, you will be transported back to the hotel.







Embark on a full-day excursion exploring Semenggoh Wildlife where you can witness orangutans during their feeding time and learn about conservation efforts. Then, visit Sarawak Cultural Village and explore authentic longhouses representing Sarawak's diverse ethnic groups, engage in cultural activities, and savor local specialties. Conclude with a scenic cruise from Santubong Boat Club, searching for the rare Irrawaddy dolphin amidst mangrove swamps.

Your day begins early with a thrilling adventure to the Semenggoh Wildlife Centre, located just 20 kilometers south of Kuching. This center, situated within the Semenggoh Nature Reserve, is the largest Orangutan Rehabilitation Centre in Sarawak. Established in 1975, its primary mission is to provide a safe haven for injured, orphaned, or illegally held pet orangutans. Today, it serves as a habitat for these incredible creatures and as an educational hub for visitors. You'll arrive at the center by 9:00 am, just in time for the morning feeding session. For an hour, you'll have the unique opportunity to observe these magnificent orangutans up close, learning about their behavior, habitat, and the crucial conservation efforts taking place. Discover the striking fact that orangutans share 97% of their DNA with humans, making them our closest relatives in the animal kingdom.



After your exciting orangutan encounter, you'll head to the Sarawak Cultural Village, an award-winning living museum that spans across 17 acres of lush land, conveniently located near the Damai Beach Resort and Hotels. This half-day adventure is your gateway to understanding the rich cultural tapestry of Sarawak. Your visit begins with a captivating cultural show in an air-conditioned theater. Here, Sarawak Cultural Village's talented dancers and musicians will treat you to a mesmerizing performance that showcases the diverse ethnic groups and cultures of Sarawak. You'll have the opportunity to witness enchanting performances, from Charming Orang Ulu maidens following the pattern of the hornbills to the rugged Iban warriors performing the ngajat dance with deep gongs and rainforest musical instruments.

After the cultural show, it's time for a well-deserved lunch at Restaurant Budaya, where a delicious meal is included in your program. Savor local specialties, such as soup of young cucumber leaves, minced fish, and chopped petai beans with ikan bilis.

During your free time at Sarawak Cultural Village, take a stroll to visit various cultural houses representing different ethnic groups:

 Bidayuh Longhouse: Step into the round head-house known as the Barok, filled with gongs, war drums, weapons, and wooden masks. Experience the rhythm of Bidayuh's rural activities.



- Iban Longhouse: Climb a notched log staircase to enter an Iban traditional longhouse. Be entertained by drums, gongs, and activities like Pua weaving while discovering their culture.
- Orang Ulu Longhouse: Visit the Orang Ulu Longhouse, set amidst lush tropical greenery. Be mesmerized by intricate beadwork and serenaded by the sounds of Sape and Jatung Utang.
- Chinese Farmhouse: Explore the Chinese farmhouse built at ground level, showcasing unique architecture and a pepper garden.
- Melanau Tall House: Discover the Melanau's massive house built high above the ground. Learn about sago processing and hear tales of spirits and demons.




- Malay House: Explore the wooden Malay House, built on stilts. Engage in traditional games like Gasing and Congkak and admire the house's artistic details.
- Penan Hut: Observe how Penan shelters are quickly constructed, and learn about the art of blowpipe making. You can even try your hand at blowpipe shooting.

Following the visit at the Sarawak Cultural Village, you'll drive to the Santubong Boat Club, a 30-minute journey, where you'll embark on an exciting cruise. This cruise will take you towards the mouth of the Santubong and Salak Rivers, home to the elusive and rare Irrawaddy dolphin. The Irrawaddy dolphin is known for its unique appearance

and resides in rivers, estuaries, and shallow coastal waters. Santubong is one of the prime locations in Sarawak to spot these fascinating creatures. During your two-hour journey, you'll also get to explore the heavily silted mangrove swamp, teeming with reptiles, crustaceans, and various fish species, including crocodiles, water monitor lizards, otters, and more. Seeing the dolphins is rare.

After this unforgettable adventure, your driver will take you back to your hotel. This day will undoubtedly be filled with excitement, cultural enrichment, and a deeper understanding of Sarawak's diverse heritage and remarkable wildlife.

Embark on an adventure into the deep rainforests of Mulu National Park and discover the UNESCO-listed park's stunning biodiversity and the renowned Mulu Caves, among the world's largest. Explore Deer Cave and Lang's Cave, marveling at their vast limestone formations and stalactites. Witness the spectacular bat exodus at dusk before returning to the Marriott Mulu Resort & Spa for a relaxing evening and dinner.

After an early breakfast, head to Kuching Airport for a flight to Mulu, where you'll transfer to the hotel situated near the Gunung Mulu National Park. This UNESCO World Heritage site is renowned for its remarkable biodiversity, pristine old-growth tropical forests, and impressive karst features. Within this park lies the famed Mulu Caves, one of the largest and most awe-inspiring cave systems on our planet. Nestled in the lush Borneo rainforest, the luxurious 5-star Mulu Marriott Resort & Spa offers breathtaking vistas and well-appointed accommodations, perched on raised wooden walkways. Each room is adorned with plush bedding and boasts a private balcony with picturesque views.

Designed in the style of ethnic longhouses, Mulu Marriott Resort & Spa was built on wooden stilts, three meters above the ground. Linked by a series of wooden walkways, the Resort stands on the banks of the Melinau River.



You will be staying in a comfortable Deluxe King Room with balcony. The Resort has its own water treatment plant, which supplies all guest rooms with clean and safe water. Every room enjoys a spacious veranda, which offers guests a stunning view of either the rich surrounding jungle or the Melinau River.


Upon your arrival, you may have the opportunity to check in at your hotel. If time does not permit, you'll proceed directly to the park HQ. Please bear in mind that all National Park tours are group activities, not private. At 2:15 pm, rendezvous with your guide at Park HQ and embark on a 3-kilometer journey through the rainforest via a boardwalk. The park, listed as a World Heritage site, boasts mesmerizing limestone formations, including colossal caves, extensive cave networks, rock pinnacles, cliffs, and gorges. Its cave system is the largest known in the world, sculpted over time by surface water, resulting in massive passages through the bedrock.

Your adventure will take you to the jaw-dropping Deer Cave, one of the world's largest cave passages, spanning 2.2 kilometers in length and reaching a height of 220 meters at its zenith. This limestone mountain was once traversed by a powerful underground river, which sculpted the cave into its current magnificent form, with most sections reaching heights of up to 148 meters. You'll even spot a remarkable rock formation within the cave that resembles the profile of President Lincoln. The sheer enormity of the cave is a sight to behold and must be seen to be fully appreciated.



After your exploration of Deer Cave, your guide will lead you to Lang's Cave. While not as vast as Deer's Cave, Lang's Cave is renowned for its spectacular stalactites and stalagmites, making it a must-see within Mulu National Park. Following your visit to both caves, you'll make your way to the bat observatory to witness the mesmerizing bat exodus, usually occurring around 5:30 pm. Within the caves, a total of 12 bat species have been recorded, including a staggering 2.5 to 3.5 million wrinkle-lipped bats. As the sun approaches the horizon, bat hawks assemble on the cliff face, anticipating the mass bat exodus.

After this captivating spectacle, you'll return to Park Headquarters via the 3-kilometer boardwalk trail, with the opportunity to spot nocturnal wildlife along the way. Later, you'll return to your hotel for a delightful dinner and a restful night's sleep





Discover traditional Singapore on Malaya Travel's Pulau Ubin Day Trip. From birdwatching at Kebun Baru Birdsinging Club to exploring the city's last remanining village, Lorong Buangkok Kampong, immerse yourself in Singapore's heritage. Then, take a bumboat to Pulau Ubin for half a day full of nature and history, and end the day with a private sunset cruise taking you to your next accomodation on Sentosa Island.

Begin your day with a delicious breakfast at your hotel, preparing you for an exciting day of exploration and relaxation. Head to the National Park Entrance to embark on your adventure. First, you will board a traditional longboat at the National Park Entrance for a picturesque 20-minute journey up the Melinau River. Along the way, you'll make a stop at a Penan handicraft market, where you can admire and purchase unique local crafts. Upon your arrival at Wind Cave, embark on an enchanting exploration. Discover the "King's Chamber" and wander through the mesmerizing forest of stalagmites and stalactites within the cave. Learn about the geological processes that have shaped these incredible formations over time.

Return to your longboat and continue just a few minutes up the river to Clearwater jetty. Here, you'll climb 200 steps to reach the main entrance of the Clearwater cave system, which spans a remarkable 227 kilometers and houses Asia's longest underwater river.



Explore the captivating wonders of this extensive cave system. After visiting both caves, savor a simple picnic by the river, surrounded by the lush Borneo rainforest. Take the opportunity to cool off and rejuvenate with a refreshing dip in Clearwater Pool. Hop back onto your longboat for a 20-minute scenic ride back to the Park HQ. Along the way, you'll pass by Penan settlements, providing insight into the local culture and way of life.

In the afternoon, treat yourself to a serene and luxurious spa experience at your hotel's Mandara Spa or explore some of the other parts of the national park on some selected unguided tours

Your dinner will be served at the resort. The evening is yours to spend. Use this time to explore the surroundings, relax by the pool, or simply unwind in the comfort of your room, ensuring a perfect end to a day filled with adventure and rejuvenation.









Bid farewell to Mulu after breakfast and head to Mulu Airport for daily flights to Kota Kinabalu, Kuching, or Miri. Convenient flight connections open doors to further exploration. The five premium Ranee Suites (adults only), named after members of the Brooke dynasty, offer grandeur under the old shophouse eaves. With large windows and verandahs, you can soak in picturesque views of the bustling bazaar, the river, and colonial heritage structures. You're perfectly positioned for exploring Kuching's historic and multicultural treasures. The hotel takes its name from the wife of a Rajah, and its interiors reflect the period theme with antique touches.

A gift shop offers high-quality Sarawakian crafts, and a tour desk helps arrange sightseeing trips. The rooms vary, with some facing air-wells and others the river or car park. Executive rooms are more spacious, while the top-tier Ranee suites, like Margaret and Sylvia, feature private terraces. In-room amenities include king-sized beds, work desks, and slate-lined bathrooms with various conveniences. The MBar & Bistro on the ground floor serves meals and drinks, including local specialties like laksa, and intriguing cocktails, such as the Borneo Black Magick with Guinness. Families can book a room with two double beds, but children are not accepted in the Ranee suites. 
